(C) The D5 Central Animal Nursery will be in Philip on August 21st. (D) Reviewed the upcoming scheduled sporting events. (E) Thank you to Mrs. Lisa Schofield for all of her help in keeping people out of the Armory while the floors were finished. It looks great.
- 15-46 Superintendent Keven Morehart reported on the following items: (A) The buildings are ready for the start of school. (B) Discussed the joint convention that he attended along with board members Thorson, Brech, and Peterson. (C) The first of day football and volleyball practice will be on August 14th and cross country practice will begin on August 18th. (D) Planning is in the works with New Underwood, Wall, and Kadoka about a possible joint in-service in November. If this works out, we will need to change our in-service date from January to November. (E) Student enrollment should still be right around 300. (F) Attended the Superintendent conference in Pierre. (G) There is a bee infestation problem at Deep Creek. Spray has been purchased and Adam Roseth is trying to take care of it for us. If this doesn't work, landowner Lee Briggs has agreed to contact the beekeeper and have the bees relocated further away from the school (H) We have been fortunate to receive a \$20,000 grant from West River Water Development and a \$10,000 grant from DENR Small Community Planning to be used for the engineering costs associated with work on the geothermal ponds/well. Engineering reports are still in process and will be received by the next meeting. (I) We are also very grateful to have received a gift in the amount of \$11,600 from the Bev Tucker Fund at Black Hills Area Community Foundation. A thank-you letter was mailed to Mrs. Constance Tucker. Again, we are so thankful for all three of these grants/gifts.
